

SLTA Tour Regulations: Revised in 2023 (First Update in September 2020)

This document and the content pertaining to it formulate the revised Sri Lanka Tennis Association Tournament regulations. All regulations in this document will be enforced/applied from 1st January 2023. Barring minor changes with annual revisions, all core portions of the document are expected to be retained until December 31st 2027.

Section 1: Tennis Property

For all practical purposes, "SLTA TOUR" will exclusively be a tennis property managed on ground by the Sri Lanka Tennis Association (SLTA), and governed by the following set of regulations, which may be upgraded from time to time.

Section 2: Property Name and Representations Allowed

1. The competition shall be called 'The SLTA TOUR'. However, if the SLTA enters into a sponsorship arrangement, the name of the sponsor shall, for the duration of that arrangement, be incorporated into the name of the Club Tour.
 - (a) The "SLTA TOUR" shall be open for participation to all players who register themselves with the SLTA Players Identification System.
 - (b) The "SLTA TOUR" shall be a property of the Sri Lanka Tennis Association and shall also be governed by its Rules and Regulations and incorporate alterations to these regulations from time to time for the betterment of the competition structure.
2. The "SLTA TOUR" shall be administered by the "SLTA Tournaments Department".

Section 3: SLTA Tour Fees

All competing players shall procure an SLTA Players Registration Number and pay a registration fee for the same to be eligible to enter the SLTA TOUR events. The amount of the registration fee shall be determined by the "SLTA TOUR" department. (Refer Page 12 Section XIV.)

Section 4: Player Eligibility

1. Any player entitled to play the SLTA TOUR events, must possess an SLTA Players Id which can be obtained by registering on the SLTA website.
2. Such a player must also be in good standing with the SLTA and abide by the competitive rules and regulations as set forth by SLTA from time to time.

Section 5: SLTA Tour Tournaments

Section 5A: AGE CATEGORIES

SLTA Tour ranking tournaments are limited to the following age categories:

- **12 and under (U12):** Players are allowed to play in a 12 & Under event until the year the players turn 12 years of age. For 2023, this means players born on or after **1 January 2011** can participate in the 12 & Under events.
- **14 and under (U14):** Players are allowed to play in a 14 & Under event until the year the players turn 14 years of age. For 2023, this means players born on or after **1 January 2009** can participate in the 14 & Under events.
- **16 and under (U16):** Players are allowed to play in an 16 & Under event until the year the players turn 16 years of age. For 2023, this means players born on or after **1 January 2007** can participate in the 16 & Under events.
- **18 and under (U18):** Players are allowed to play in an 18 & Under event until the year the players turn 18 years of age. For 2023, this means players born on or after **1 January 2005** can participate in the 18 & Under events.
- **Open Events:** Eligible for any player who has already turned **14 years of age**.

Additionally, Cool Tennis events exist for younger age groups, where matches are played using the ITF colour ball system. For these events, there are no stipulated national rankings. The events include:

- **7 and Under (U7):** Players are allowed to play in a 7 and Under event until the year the player turns 7 years of age. For 2023 this means players born on or after **1 January 2016** can participate in the Under 7 events.
- **8 and Under (U8):** Players are allowed to play in an 8 and Under event until the year the player turns 8 years of age. For 2023 this means players born on or after **1 January 2015** can participate in the Under 7 events.
- **9 and Under (U9):** Players are allowed to play in a 9 and Under event until the year the player turns 9 years of age. For 2023 this means players born on or after **1 January 2014** can participate in the Under 7 events.
- **10 and Under (U10):** Players are allowed to play in a 10 and Under event until the year the player turns 10 years of age. For 2023 this means players born on or after **1 January 2013** can participate in the Under 7 events.

Section 5B: EVENT CATEGORIES

SLTA Tour tournaments will be of the following event structure:

- Sri Lanka Nationals
 - Offers the highest ranking points on the SLTA Tour
- Category 1
 - SLTA Tour Masters Series
 - Tournaments include Colombo Championships, Sri Lanka Hard Court Championships, SSC, and Queen's Club Championships
 - Second highest ranking points on offer on the SLTA Tour.
- Category 2
 - Sri Lanka Tour Challenger Series
 - Third highest ranking points on offer on the SLTA Tour.
- Category 3
 - Sri Lanka Tour Satellite Series
 - Fourth highest ranking points on offer on the SLTA Tour.
- Category 4
 - Sri Lanka Development Series A
 - Fifth highest ranking points on offer on the SLTA Tour.
- Category 5
 - Sri Lanka Development Series B
 - Least ranking points on offer on the SLTA Tour.
 - All players within the top 15 in the U12/14 age category rankings and top 10 in the U16/U18 age category rankings will not be permitted to take part in category 5 events as they are meant to be entry level

Section 5C: TOURNAMENT ENTRY/ELIGIBILITY AND MATCH FORMATS

Sri Lanka Nationals and Category 1

- **Entry Criteria:** Open to all players regardless of the ranking, and in the juniors conditioned on the players' age
- **Draws:**
 - Singles: Main draw of 32 players, and qualifying rounds will be played prior to this
 - Doubles: Main draw of 32 pairs, and qualifying rounds will be played prior to this
- **Qualifying Round Match Formats (Singles):**
 - Open/U18s: Best of three Sets, 1st 2 sets regular tie break sets with no Advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak
 - U16s/U14s/U12s: Best of three short sets, no advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak
- **Junior Main Draw Match Formats (Singles - Up to and including R16):**
 - U18s/U16s: Best of three Sets, 1st 2 sets regular tie break sets with Advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak
 - U14s/U12s: Best of three short sets with advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak
- **Junior Main Draw Match Formats (Singles - From quarterfinals onwards):**
 - U18s/U16s/U12s/U14s: Best of three regular sets with advantage, third set regular tiebreak set
- **Open Main Draw Match Formats for Singles:**
 - Nationals (Up and including to quarterfinals): Best of three tiebreak sets with advantage (full tiebreak set for third set)
 - Category 1 (Up to and including semifinals): Best of three tie break sets with advantage (full tiebreak set for third set)
 - Nationals (semifinals onwards) and Category 1 (finals only): Best of five tiebreak sets with advantage, final set full set tiebreak
- **Doubles Match Formats:**
 - Open/U18s (all matches): Best of three Sets, 1st 2 sets regular tiebreak sets with no Advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak
 - U16s/U14s/U12s (qualifying and up to main R16): Best of three short sets, no advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak
 - U16s/U14s/U12s (from quarterfinals onwards): Best of three Sets, 1st 2 sets regular tiebreak sets with no Advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak

Category 2

- **Entry Criteria:** Open to all players regardless of the ranking, and in the juniors conditioned on the players' age
- **Draws:** Main draw accommodating all entered players
- **Main Draw Match Formats (Up to R16):**
 - Open: Best of three Sets, 1st 2 sets regular tiebreak sets with Advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak
 - U18s/U16s: Best of three Sets, 1st 2 sets regular tiebreak sets with no Advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak
 - U14s/U12s: Best of three short sets with no advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak
- **Main Draw Match Formats (From Quarters Onwards):**
 - Open/U18s/U16s: Best of three regular tiebreak sets with advantage, third set regular tiebreak set
 - U14s/U12s (quarterfinals and semifinals): Best of three regular tiebreak sets with no advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak
 - U14s/U12s (finals): Best of three regular tiebreak sets with advantage, third set regular tiebreak set
- **Doubles Match Formats:**
 - Open/U18s (all matches): Best of three Sets, 1st 2 sets regular tiebreak sets with no Advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak
 - U16s/U14s/U12s (qualifying and up to main R16): Best of three short sets, no advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak
 - U16s/U14s/U12s (from quarterfinals onwards): Best of three Sets, 1st 2 sets regular tiebreak sets with no Advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak

Category 3

- **Entry Criteria:** Open to all players regardless of the ranking, and in the juniors conditioned on the players' age
- **Draws:** Main draw accommodating all entered players
- **Main Draw Match Formats (Up to Quarters):**
 - Open: Best of three Sets, 1st 2 sets regular tiebreak sets with no Advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak
 - U14s/U12s: Best of three short sets with no advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak
- **Main Draw Match Formats (From Semis Onwards):**
 - Open/U18s/U16s: Best of three regular sets with advantage, third set regular tiebreak set
 - U14s/U12s: Best of three tiebreak sets with no advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak
- **Doubles Match Formats:**
 - Open/U18s (all matches): Best of three Sets, 1st 2 sets regular tiebreak sets with no Advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak
 - U16s/U14s/U12s (qualifying and up to main R16): Best of three short sets, no advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak
 - U16s/U14s/U12s (from quarterfinals onwards): Best of three Sets, 1st 2 sets regular tiebreak sets with no Advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak

Category 4 and 5

- Entry Criteria:
 - No Open Events or Doubles Events
 - Category 4: Open to all players regardless of the ranking, and in the juniors conditioned on the players' age
 - Category 5: All players within the top 15 in the U12/14 age category rankings and top 10 in the U16/U18 age category rankings will not be permitted to take part in category 5 events as they are meant to be entry level
- Draws: Main draw accommodating all entered players
- Main Draw Match Formats (Up to Quarters):
 - All age groups: Best of three short sets with no advantage, third set super tiebreak
- Main Draw Match Formats (From Semis Onwards):
 - U18s/U16s: Best of three regular sets with advantage, third set super tiebreak
 - U14s/U12s: Best of three regular sets with no advantage, third set decided by a super tiebreak

NOTE: The referee and tournament organizers in consultation with the SLTA Tournament and Matches Committee can change the format of the matches pertaining to any age category at their own discretion if circumstances force this (e.g. multiple rain delays, situation in country etc.)

Section 5D: TOURNAMENT DURATION: WEEK AND WEEKEND TOURNAMENTS

The SLTA TOUR would comprise of the following two type of tournaments:

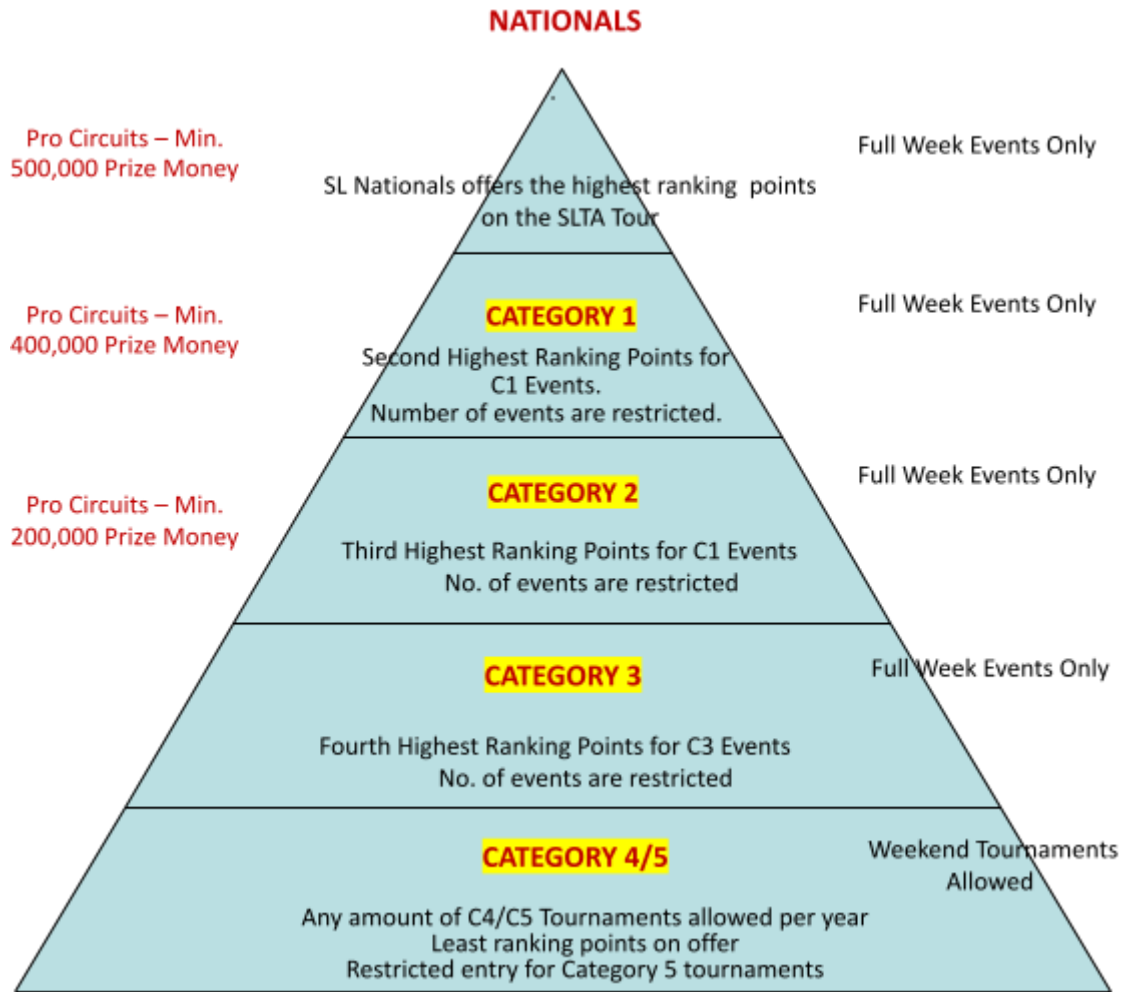
1. "Week Tournaments" – Starting with a Friday Sign-In, the tournament would play Qualifying Rounds on Saturday & Sunday, and the Main Draw of the event would start on Monday. Finals of the tournament would be played according to the draw size.
 - a. Each "Week Tournament" would host both Singles and Doubles category in every age category allowed.
2. "Weekend Tournaments" – Starting with a Friday morning Sign-In, the tournament would be played only on the weekends, ie. Friday, Saturday & Sunday. These tournaments would only consist of Main Draw for every age category allowed.
 - a. Each "Weekend Tournament" would host only Singles event in the age category allowed on the first weekend. Doubles of the very same tournament would be played on the next weekend. Both these events would be considered as one (1) tournament, comprising Singles & Doubles on different weekends.
3. Category 1, 2 & 3 tournaments being the higher ranking point tournaments, will be full "Week Tournaments" only. No weekend competition will be allowed in C1, C 2 & C 3 Tournaments.
4. Category 4 and Category 5 tournaments are expected to follow the weekend tournament format.

All tournaments must offer to play both Male & Female events for each opted age category.

Time Period Allocated to Finish Tournaments

1. Any event that has been started within the timeframe allocated to a Nationals or Category 1 tournament must be finished by the lapse of this timeframe and additional days that are provided to account for delays.
2. Events that have not been started may be postponed to a different time, or canceled altogether - in the latter case, all entrants will be refunded the entry fee fully.
3. The additional days allocated to an event depend on the category of the event, as follows (subject to revision based on the decision of the tournament and matches committee if an appeal is made by the tournament organizers):
 - a. Nationals: To be decided by the committee as per the situation
 - b. Category 1: 5 days
 - c. Category 2 and 3: 3 days
 - d. Category 4 and 5: 1 day

Section 5F: COST OF LEASING SLTA TOUR EVENTS

The following would be the cost of leasing out SLTA Tour events in 2023:

- Sri Lanka Nationals: Rs. 20,000
- Category 1: Rs. 15,000
- Category 2: Rs. 7,000
- Category 3: Rs. 6,500
- Category 4: Rs. 6,000
- Category 5: Rs. 5,000

Section 5G: OBLIGATIONS OF TOUR ORGANIZERS

The Tournament Organizers should be able to meet the following criteria in order to be eligible for SLTA TOUR Events; (Minimum Requirement)

1. Number of courts for each tournament category: Refer to Appendix 5G at the end of Section 5G for further elaboration
2. All the matches in all tournaments must be conducted at the region prescribed to it.
3. The Tournaments Organizers should stick to the prescribed match format assigned to each category and age group respectively as listed under “**Section 5C: TOURNAMENT ENTRY/ELIGIBILITY AND MATCH FORMATS**” (Pages XX - XX). Care must be taken to not change the format of matches unless absolutely necessary due to delays and unforeseen circumstances, in which case at least the minimum format must be played.
4. An independent Referee must be provided for looking after SLTA TOUR Regulations & Rules of Tennis during the event. An ITF Certified Referee would be a must for all events from Category 4 Onwards.
 - a. Note: A non ITF Certified Referee may be appointed to run Category 5 tournaments with prior consent of the SLTA Tournaments Department. Such a Referee must be an SLTA Certified Official having undertaken SLTA National Level 1 Officiating Course.
5. Other facilities that must be provided by the tournaments:
 - a. ITF approved balls.
 - b. Sufficient numbers of court supervisors or roving umpires for matches in initial rounds.
 - c. Qualified chair umpires must be provided for:
 - Quarterfinals onwards for the Sri Lanka Nationals and Category 1 tournaments.
 - Semifinals onwards for all other categories.
 - The above may be revised by the tournament committee if sufficient personnel are not available on a given day of the tournament.
 - d. Certificates for all participants.
 - e. Medals / Trophies for Finalists and Winners (Both Singles and Doubles).
 - f. Tournament Physio / Trainer while matches are in play.
 - g. On Site Clean & Hygienic Toilets
 - h. Refer to Appendix 5G on page xx for further elaboration on all conditions that need to be met by tour organizers
6. Tournament Organizers desirous of organizing Pro Circuit events, must follow the minimum Prize Money schedule as provided for in Section 5I (Page xx).

Key notes:

- **Category 5:** Top 15 ranking in 12 / 14 and top 10 players in 16 / 18 will not be allowed to play.
- **Players' lounge:** If the venue does not have a place to be used as players' lounge, a temporary hut should be fixed (Nationals and Category 1)
- **Rowing Umpires:** Maximum 2 courts per rowing umpire.
- **Trophies and certificates:** The trophies and certificates should be given within a week completion of the tournaments (certificate from quarters is mandatory)

Section 5H: OBLIGATIONS OF PLAYERS AND PARENTS/GUARDIANS

1. All players and their parents / guardians registering under the SLTA TOUR, agree to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the SLTA TOUR, by default.
2. All players must enter the SLTA TOUR Tournaments via their player's zone. Any withdrawals from the tournaments must also be made via their Players Zone.
3. All SLTA TOUR Events would be governed with Entry and Withdrawal Deadlines which would be displayed on the factsheets released for the purpose.
4. A player would be considered as committed to play a tournament once entered into a tournament, unless he / she withdraws by the withdrawal deadline.
5. Wednesday of the same week prior to the start of matches would be treated as the Freeze Deadline for a player to withdraw. 6 withdrawals by the Freeze Deadline per year would be allowed per player and would not be penalized.
6. 7th subsequent withdrawal made after the Withdrawal Deadline would be penalized by deduction of ranking points from a players accumulation of points earned from SLTA TOUR events

Section 5I: PRIZE MONEY STRUCTURE FOR SLTA PRO-CIRCUIT OPEN EVENTS

Any Tournament Organizer wishing to organize SLTA TOUR – Pro Circuit events pertaining to any category including Category 2, must oblige by arranging the following Prize Money per event category.

Mixed doubles should not be less than 50% of the regular doubles.

Section 5J: CODE VIOLATIONS

Players giving Walkovers in any tournaments without assigning and submitting a proper medical certificate defining the reasons of their No Show, would be penalized for not showing up for their matches in the following manner.

- No Show / Walkovers in Main Draws: **Penalty of 50 Points from Best 10 Results**
- Not Withdrawing By Withdrawal Deadline: **Penalty of 50 Points from Best 10 Results**

SECTION 5K: COMBINED JUNIORS RANKING

1. The Combined Junior Ranking shall take into account the following from the preceding 52 weeks to arrive at an objective 52 week rolling ranking to be updated every Monday of the week:
 - a. Twelve Best Singles results obtained in SLTA TOUR Events Category 1 - 5 constituting SLTA TOUR "Ranking Tournaments").
 - b. For ranking calculations, the results in the Sri Lanka Nationals and the two best Category 1 results are compulsorily factored in, i.e. (Nationals) + (Best Two Cat 1) + (Best Nine Remaining). International events will also be factored in as part of this calculation.
 - c. One Quarter (25%) of the Six nBest Doubles results, obtained in SLTA "Ranking Tournaments"
2. Players shall be accorded points for participation in SLTA TOUR Ranking Tournaments (Nationals and Category 1) as per the ranking points table given below.

3. Players shall be accorded points for participation in SLTA TOUR Ranking Tournaments (Category 2 to Category 5) as per the ranking points table given below.

4. Any event that has 5 entries or less, round robin match format will be played. With half (0.5) points allocated using the table above. E.g. Winner of Cat 2 will be awarded 400 points. The ranking points will be awarded as, 1st Place – Winner, 2nd Place – Runner up, 3rd and 4th place – Semi Finalists and 5th place – Quarter Finalist.
5. Top ten players at the date of entry deadline for the tournament can only compete in two Category 5 tournaments (only applicable for Jr events)

6. SLTA TOUR Ranking Points will also be awarded for players playing the following International ranking tournaments: **(Note: The players must approach the SLTA Tournaments Department with their standings, and submit the results to be eligible to be allocated the points for these events within 28 days of event completion).**
- a. Points for playing ITF Juniors (U18) tournaments: Direct conversion of an ITF point to 150 SLTA Tour points in the SLTA Tour U18 Rankings Category. Losers in the first round of ITF J4 and J5 category and points for performance in qualifying rounds are further specified in the table below:

- c. Points for playing ATF Juniors (U14) tournaments: Direct conversion of an ATF point to 5 SLTA Tour points in the SLTA Tour U18 Rankings Category.
7. For junior events - After the trials process is completed and the final team positions are nominated by the Selectors, the team members (depending upon the team composition) will be allocated 500 points in the relevant age category.

These points are only allocated for teams representing Sri Lanka at ITF events (WJT, Jr Davis Cup, Jr Fed Cup and U12 Asian Regional Event)

If any player is replaced for another event of the same category (e.g. JDC Pre-qualifying to qualifying) the new entrant will also receive the same points as the player he/she replaces.

All team members who played the tie will receive (excluding any reserves) the following points individually

Points for performance at the team event

Juniors International Team competitions

Points will be awarded in the relevant age category for ITF final qualifying team events only (WJT, Jr Davis Cup, Jr Fed Cup and U12 Asian Regional Events only). Points will not be awarded for Pre-qualifying events.

SECTION 5L: RANKINGS FOR SLTA TOUR PRO-CIRCUIT OPEN EVENTS

1. Singles and doubles results will be calculated as two separate rankings in separate ranking sheets.
2. The number of results taken into consideration are twelve (12) best results.
3. For ranking calculations, the results in the Sri Lanka Nationals and the two best Category 1 results are compulsorily factored in, i.e. (Nationals) + (Best Two Cat 1) + (Best Nine Remaining). International events will also be factored in as part of this calculation.
4. Players shall be accorded points for participation in SLTA TOUR Ranking Tournaments (Nationals and Category 1) as per the ranking points table given below.

- a. 1 ATP/WTA point is equal to 5000 local ranking points for the Open Events only.
- b. 1 ITF Pro circuit point is equal to 1000 local ranking points, in the Open events only.
- c. Open Singles Ranking Points for playing ITF Pro Circuits Qualifying Rounds
